<p>Run Report no. 1972, January 3rd 2023</p> <p><i>It was eight o'clock on a winter's evening. Four runners and a hare huddled suspiciously in a back street car park. Thin, dingy rain spat and drizzled. The pavements shone long and yellow, illuminated by the glowing street lights. Wind twisted the trees and blew debris across the foot paths.</i></p> <p><i>Meanwhile, Pusseye stood alone outside The Old House at Home wondering if she had the right location and contemplating a route of her own.</i></p> <p><i>The small but enthusiastic pack of Hashers set off through the wet and windy back streets of Dorking, past the home of the Wanderers and over the railway line. the hash on 27/12/22 before handing the responsibility of ensuring the hash didn't get lost over to Calamity.

Having started a trend with my hash of not being from a pub, this one started from 24 Ferndale Avenue, Megabits current abode, with not even a car park available. My sat nav having been programmed to delivery me to number 24 accurately delivered me leaving me just 200 yards to walk to the house number 24.

Despite heavy rain the preceding Sunday I had been pleasantly surprised on repeating my December Hash for Guildford to find significantly less shiggy than I expected. In view of this, although rain was forecast for the evening, as Ferndale tends to be urban rather than rural I anticipated that little shiggy would be encountered on the run.

It appeared that the Hash had a similar view, although the promise of "bread, cheese etc" being provided may have had some influence on this, as by the off a pack of 12 consisting of Wurzel, Kebab, Tight Git, Pusseye, Naked Chief, Top Man, Tosser, Wazzer, Master Bates, The Great Bear and the very welcome return of Spanish Mistress and Sodden Assets who have been AWOL for some time, had assembled.

The hare greeted us with the news that the promised of "bread, cheese etc" had transmogrified into Chilli with tacos and other accoutrements, although as their attendance had not been anticipated, not such good news for the vegetarians Spanish Mistress and Sodden Assets who had to be content with the tacos and accoutrements. He then briefed us, saying that because of the weather forecast and the need to avoid burning the Chilli he had shortened the run and might provide "encouragement" if the pack struggled to solve checks.

Starting out we weaved our way through the local residential streets before diving off down a footpath which was so muddy that even the most reluctant hashers gave up trying to avoid it. This was only the beginning, shortly after we came across a flooded underpass in which the water was deep enough to float a fence panel and came up to my my knees. The Great Bears attempt to cheat by using the panel as a raft to avoid the full experience was thwarted by his weight, the panel sank!

A short respite with some black top was followed by more shiggy and a footpath which, if it had not had a certain smell, I would have believed had pretensions to being a small river. Some more tarmac and further shiggy some of which this time had pretensions to being a road building site brought us back onto further black-top and to the on-on which, as a result of the hares "encouragement" was achieved in just over an hour.

The pack settled down to enjoy the tasty and substantial chilli that Mega Bit (apparently assisted by his son) had produced and which we found had been looked after for much of our absence by Tosser, Wasser and Master Bates who had selflessly turned back at the flooded underpass to look after the chilli, apparently being joined shortly afterwards by Len.

Following some discussion the hash managed to dissuade Master Bates from trying to establish whether they could be combined into 1 large one.....

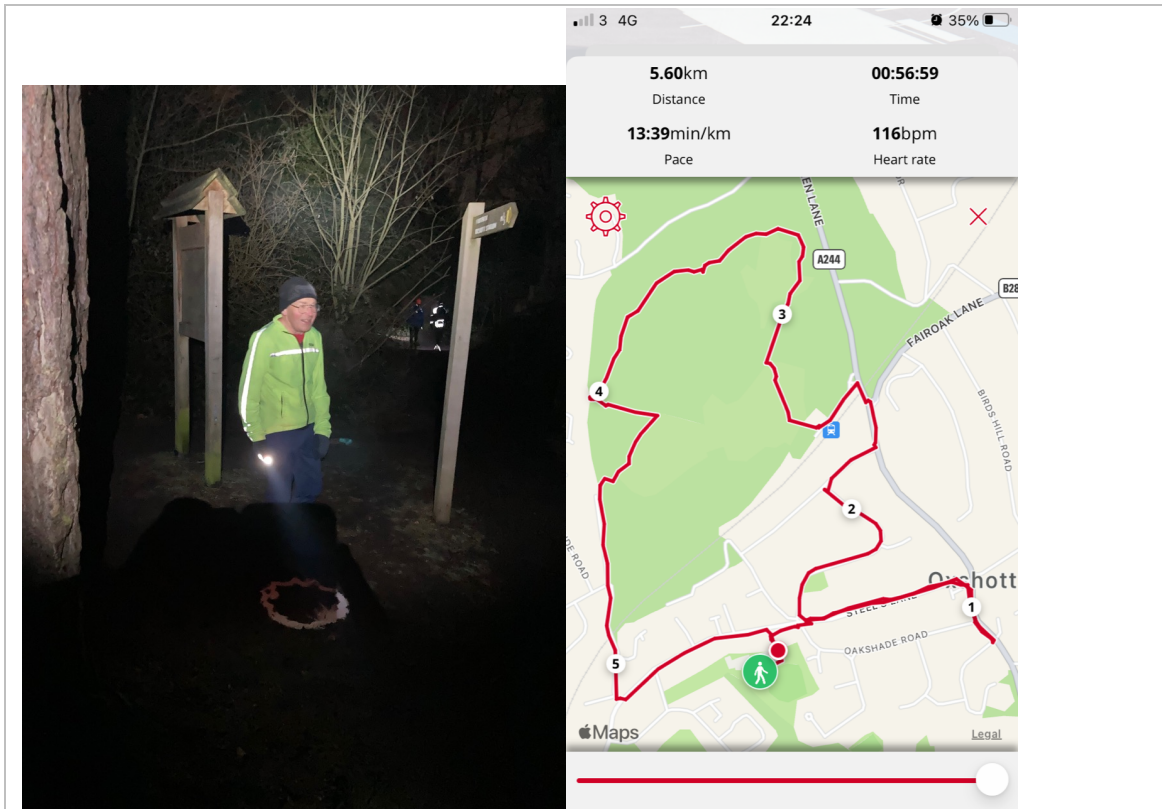
